Horizons at SFFS provides joyful academic and enrichment learning opportunities that build on the skills and talents of students in SF public schools. Students join Horizons at SFFS in Kindergarten and participate consistently through 8th Grade, participating in a comprehensive summer program as well as year-round tutoring and enrichment referral opportunities. Beyond 8th grade, Horizons at SFFS is expanding to provide students recurring high school success workshops as well as mentorship and internship opportunities. Horizons currently serves 155 students from Kindergarten through eighth grade.

We are currently recruiting for a hands-on Executive Director (ED) to build on the success of Horizons and steer its next phase of growth. Reporting to the Board of Directors and Head of School, the ED is responsible for all aspects of planning, programs, funding, administration and evaluation for this small, growing nonprofit organization.

As Executive Director you will:

- imes Partner with the Board to establish and achieve strategic goals.
- Build and manage relationships with key constituencies (e.g., families, students, BOD, donors, and partners, including the San Francisco Friends School).
- imes Hire, train and supervise seasonal and year-round staff, including teachers.

- ∑ Manage fundraising/development, including grants, donors, and annual events.
- \checkmark Manage the annual budget and maintain fiscal oversight.

COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

We offer competitive pay of \$140,000-\$165,000 depending on experience, and comprehensive benefits in a casual office setting on the Friends School campus in the Mission neighborhood of San Francisco. Some night/weekend work and local travel required. **During the summer months, the Executive Director is required to be on-site full-time.** During non-summer months remote work is possible one or two days a week, after the role is established, and to be determined in partnership with the SFFS Head of School. Horizons is a fiscally-sponsored partner of the San Francisco Friends School and an affiliate of the Horizons National Network.
