Why are Horizons programs so important to advancing education equity following the pandemic?

By the 5th grade, summer learning loss can leave some students 2.5 to 3 years behind their peers. Because of COVID-19, these losses have only compounded, and they will be felt for decades to come. However, experts recognize that programs like ours make up for the difference and level the playing field for all students.¹

Horizons provides a multi-year solution that supports children and their families from pre-kindergarten through high school graduation over the summer, after school, and on weekends throughout the year.

Horizons students go on to earn higher elementary math and science standardized assessment scores, higher GPAs in the 9th and 10th grade, and higher graduation rates.

Long-term and effective - According to a longitudinal study conducted by RAND Summer Learning Series, students who participate in 5-week summer learning programs over consecutive summers experience benefits in math and language arts.² The same study notes that effective summer programs are:
